Parking Rule Changed

SEA ISLE CITY - The city will provide for more visibility at the crosswalk of 84th Street and Landis Avenue after a 9-year-old girl was hit by a car and injured there July 10. Curbs will be painted yellow near the intersection, where cars had been parked thus obstructing the view of motorists. Mark Ruggiano, who owns Method Skate Shop, an ice-cream shop, and a deli, suggested that the city install a blinking light and a streetlight to further warn motorists. Bright yellow signs currently warn of the upcoming crosswalk and pedestrians. Ruggiano said that there was another accident July 8 involving a 13-year-old boy who was hit on his bicycle by an SUV. The boy involved in the accident was shaken up, but escaped serious injuries, according to Ruggiano. The young girl, who was released from a Camden County hospital July11, reportedly sustained a concussion and cuts to her face.
